"It was a rather greyer day than of late with a touch of drizzle in the air, but as soon as we arrived at Downton House in Painswick, the spirits lifted. HAVE YOU HEARD ABOUT GLOUCESTER'S HUGE GREEN WALL?

Work is set to begin this month on a green wall aimed at reducing both noise and air pollution and increasing biodiversity in Gloucester city. The green wall, at the Forum, on the £107 million pound development's multi-storey car park, will cover an area of about 600 sq m with plants. Green walls help to cool and insulate buildings; attract pollinators; and help absorb sound.

The building itself has been built with eco credentials in mind, and aims to be netzero carbon, with electricity produced through renewable methods such as rooftop solar panels.

Work will also start now on the next phase of work to revamp Westgate Street, funded by Historic England and Gloucester City Council. This will include trees and planters for shade - the temperature beneath trees can be up to 12 degrees cooler. The planting of bio-diverse varieties is designed to attract pollinators and help address air quality.
