SMALL GROUP VISIT TO LITTLE ORCHARD, SLAD

After our extraordinary July visit to Hardy Amies's garden, Natalie met the challenge of organising another impressive visit for us in August with our trip to Little Orchard in the lovely Slad Valley. Again, we met remarkable, hospitable owners who were happy to talk us through their creation of both house and garden. Rod was a professional cidermaker, so a bonus is the onsite cidery with tastings available and bottles for sale.

Rod and Terry have transformed one acre of steep, grassy hillside into terraces whose garden rooms include raised vegetable beds, herbaceous borders, and both a Mediterranean and a Japanese garden. There are hot tubs, water features, statuary, old farm implements, a shepherd's hut and lovely old stone troughs – and, of course, the splendid views.





Both house and garden reflect the Rod's passion for reclamation yards and recycling and his skill at repurposing objects for both – for example, the fine decorative iron girders which now support the ceiling of the sitting room. The house was built piecemeal when their budget allowed enough for another room or wall or feature to be added - and it is all their own work! What was once a tiny bungalow is now a stunning large house with indoor swimming pool and beautiful views across the valley.

If you missed this opportunity, the garden usually opens in May for the National Garden Scheme.

DID YOU KNOW?

- You can help Harvest Mice, now on the Red List for endangered mammals
 in this country. Just download the survey pack from the Mammal Society
 Website and the free Mammal Mapper App. Then survey between October
 and March in areas of long grass and reed beds to spot their distinctive
 spherical nests. No prior experience needed! Send your survey back even if
 it is a nil return.

- A London grapefruit tree brought from Grenada to Battersea by the late Marline Anderson in the 1980's now has a Tree Protection Order after a

campaign by local residents. Probably the only one of its kind outside Kew, it has become a landmark and a memorial to Marline.

- The Coronation Community Orchard Scheme, funded by the Government, has supported numerous tree planting projects in Gloucestershire, including at Alderton, Bishop's Cleeve, Gretton, Stoke Orchard, Tewkesbury Nature Reserve, and Winchcombe School. They include many different varieties of fruit trees including apple, pear, greengage and cherry.
- The Alderton/Toddington area was once known for its fruit production and had the biggest jam factory in the country.
